Role title: Marine Adviser

Function: Marine Team: Southern Regional Seas

### **Role description**

- Providing support to Marine Lead Advisers with complex casework and leading on standard casework with guidance.
- Supporting Senior Adviser in ensuring the team delivers excellent customer service.
- Supporting Lead Advisers with work to collect, analyse, provide and manage evidence on the marine environment, including monitoring and survey work.
- Support Lead Advisers working on the designation of Marine Protected Areas
- Support work on the provision of conservation advice for European Marine Sites, possibly including Fisheries advice work.
- Provide general support for the work of Southern Regional Seas Team, as an active team member, and for work on the Hampshire and Isle of Wight marine environment in particular.

#### Technical/specialist knowledge/qualifications

- A good knowledge of marine ecology, ecosystems and species.
- Familiarity with impacts on the marine environment, their management/mitigation and marine industries and interests.



- A sound knowledge of marine legislation relevant to its application in the inshore (to 12 miles) area. Knowledge of planning legislation affecting coastal areas is also desirable.
- Experience of data analysis, monitoring in the environment, scientific survey and the use of evidence.
- Competent and experienced use of information technology including geographical information systems.
- Experience and understanding of providing excellent customer service.

Southern Regional Seas Team area covers the marine environment out to 12 miles between Lyme Regis and Chichester Harbour (Dorset, Hampshire and Isle of Wight coasts).
